Dawn is responsible for training the ANCs to prepare Quarterly Financial Reports (QFRs). Dawn works closely with the Office of the District Auditor (ODCA) to ensure that ANCs comply with the legal requirements of QFRs. She also works with the Office of the Chief Financial Officer (OCFO) to release allotments to the ANCs.

Currently, Dawn is leading the redesign of the QFR software. This project involves moving the software to a web-based platform as well as automating the process so that notices are automatically generated. These notices will inform ANCs of the report status, missing documents, and deadlines, as well as when funds are released. This project will be completed in 2023.

Dawn has a master's in public administration from the University of the District of Columbia and a bachelor's degree in finance and management information systems from LaSalle University in Philadelphia, PA. Dawn has over 25 years of experience working in non-profit and government organizations, some of which include the Department of Public and Assisted Housing (currently known as the DC Housing Authority), East of the River Community Development Corporation (ERCDC), and the American Speech Language Hearing Association (ASHA).

Commissioners and Emails

There has been much conversation about the use or non-use of government emails provided to Commissioners. Certainly, the pros outweigh the cons!

The government email system guarantees an automatic firewall between Commissioner tasks and personal events. Specifically, it provides a visual and transparent means by which a Commissioner may seek and discuss documents and records necessary to perform the duty to "advise the Council of the District of Columbia, the Mayor and each executive agency, and all independent agencies, boards and commissions of the government of the District of Columbia with respect to all proposed matters of District government policy[.]" DC Official Code, section 1-309.10(a) (as amended).

By performing these duties in the eyes of constituents, a Commissioner shows answerability for the execution of any action taken on their behalf and for kindling their hard sought trust. The Office of the Chief Technology Officer (OCTO), responsible for establishing the DC Government email system states that "[a]ppropriate use of the DC Government email system can enhance productivity and intra-governmental communication[.]" <u>OCTO Email User Policy</u> at <u>http://app.octo.dc.gov/information/policies/using_it/email_use.shtm#5</u>.

Most importantly, when called upon to search for papers sought pursuant to a DC Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, documents, reports, analyses and other records may be quickly retrieved and submitted to a Requestor.

Yet, some Commissioners have found the government email system lacking and given up using it. The OANC has heard the complaints: "it is too cumbersome," "the system is always down," or "my password does not work." Nevertheless, the OANC remedied a vast number of these situations and made believers out of the protesting Commissioners.

It must be said that operating an Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC) Single Member District (SMD) outside of the government email system can prove disastrous, especially with regard to FOIA. "When a Commissioner uses a private email account to communicate as a representative of his or her ANC, that communication amounts to a communication from the ANC itself. And when a Commissioner receives a private email message in the Commissioner's capacity as a representative of the ANC, that message amounts to a communication to the ANC." OAG Opinion, "Re: Access to Private Commissioner Emails Concerning Commission Business," dated July 1, 2020.

Significantly, the now "communication to the ANC" above is one that is subject to FOIA. Please use the government email system. Always call the OANC for assistance.
